Research Resources at Siskiyou County Museum 6/30/2020

1. *Siskiyou Pioneer* publications, published by Siskiyou County Historical Society. All issues up through 2019, including index.

2. **Photo collection**. Extensive selection organized in file folders. Some but not all have already been scanned. Scanned on request (emailed or researcher provides thumbdrive). Also **Postcards.** Several index boxes, filed by subject.

3. Vertical files. Misc. clippings, magazine articles, pamphlets, etc arranged by subject in file cabinets.

4. **Scrapbooks** mostly containing newspaper clippings dating from 2020 back to about 1950. Individual entries indexed and pages are in the process of being scanned.

5. **Pioneer biographies**. Vertical files with genealogical and other information about local families dating back to pioneer days.

6. **Family histories.** Notebooks or bound books with detailed information about some local families, generally compiled by the family.

7. High School Year books. White and Gold and Ieka. Most years.

8. Great Registers. (voter registration for several years up through 1900)

9. Maps. Assorted maps of varying ages stored in basement in tubes. Indexed, easy to retrieve.

10. **Books.** Multiple shelves of books arranged by topic (i.e. mining, logging, railroad, Native Americans, etc plus all Siskiyou County towns). Also assorted county related **ephemera**.

11. **Many Back Issues** of history publications such as *Oregon Historical Quarterly* and *Covered Wagon* (Shasta Historical Society) and others.

12. Turner Funeral Home records. Copy. Cemetery information. Evergreen, etc. Not extensive.

13. Siskiyou County Directories/Phonebooks. Some older, no recent. 1907, 1915, 1930, 1949, 1968.

14. **School teacher** information. Pamphlets covering 1970s-1980s listing all county school teachers. Also book on county schools history.

15. **Objects/Artifacts**. Past Perfect records of all catalogued artifacts in the museum. Object descriptions can yield valuable information.
